



Jimmy's Impact

Jimmy Robles' life was ravaged with drugs, hopelessness and poverty. However, in 2005, he encountered God in a drama presentation that changed his life forever. Three months later he wrote his own play, and with a cast of 44, traveled across Texas touching thousands with his amazing story of God's grace.

In 2006, wanting to do more to reach the gangs, drug addicts and prostitutes, he located his ministry in an abandoned building on the Westside of San Antonio. It was here, that Last Chance Ministries was born.

In 2012, a much larger building was found and remodeled. Currently over 800 people attend Sunday morning service at the facility. People living in the heart of the Westside of San Antonio are being transformed by this ministry.

Daily Bread Ministries provides over 7,000 pounds of food per month for this ministry, serving where 37 percent of the population live below the poverty line and more than 100,000 residents live in poverty with 35 percent of the population receiving a monthly average of \$164 in government assistance.

Last Chance Ministries (LCM) impacts the impoverished Westside of San Antonio with seven key ministries. These ministries focus on the following:

HUNGER RELIEF

Daily Bread Ministries provides the food for LCM, which is distributed every Tuesday & Thursday from 10:30am to 11:30am. Over 250 children and 350 single moms and seniors receive assistance.

Local resident Michelle Cruz says, "The need is so great, a lot of people come on the city bus and carry their food in baby strollers to return home."

Working with ten volunteers that oversee the hunger relief program, Cruz states that while many of the residents suffer from healthcare issues (especially the elderly), the greatest need is healthy nutritional food.

SINGLE MOMS AND WOMEN

LCM reaches out to over 741 families in the Alazan, Apache and Mirasol public housing units. Each month over 50 women meet to hear local business and pastors bring a lesson over a meal. Mother-daughter events are held each year, as are overnight retreats to encourage and strengthen the family unit.

CHRISTIAN SPORTS ORGANIZATION (CSO)

Over 100 local children participate in this program that includes baseball, basketball, softball, t-ball, soccer, and cheerleading. CSO is supported by political and housing authorities, who have invested in the program. Due to their success, a new baseball field has emerged with family amenities. In a partnership with Oak Hills Church new uniforms and equipment have been provided. Volunteers and additional equipment are needed.
